OPERATION

- Use this unit for cutting recommended material only. Do not use for any other purpose.
- · Never start or run the engine inside a closed area, breathing exhaust fumes can kill.
- CLEAR THE WORK AREA BEFORE EACH USE. REMOVE ALL OBJECTS SUCH AS ROCKS, BROKEN GLASS, NAILS, WIRE, OR STRING WHICH CAN BE THROWN OR BECOME ENTANGLED IN THE BLADE.
- Be sure the blade is properly installed and securely fastened. Failure to use the proper parts can cause the cutting attachment to fly off and seriously injure the operator and/or bystanders.
- Exposure to vibrations through prolonged use of gasoline powered hand tools could cause blood vessel or nerve damage
 in the fingers, hands, and wrists of people prone to circulation disorders, or abnormal swellings. Prolonged use in cold

MAINTENANCE

- Use only GREEN MACHINE® replacement parts. Failure to do so may cause poor performance and possible injury.
- Inspect unit before each use for loose fasteners, fuel leaks, etc. Replace damaged parts. Replace edger blade if cracked, chipped, or damaged in any way. Be sure the stringhead is properly installed and securely fastened. Failure to do so can cause serious injury.
- Make sure all deflectors and handles are properly and securely attached.

- The cutting head will spin during carburetor adjustments. Wear protective equipment and observe all safety instructions.
- · Before storing, allow the engine to cool.
- Empty the fuel tank and restrain the unit from moving before transporting in a vehicle.

REFUELING (DO NOT SMOKE!)


- Mix and store fuel in a container approved for gasoline.
- Mix fuel outdoors where there are no sparks or flames.
- Select bare ground, stop engine, and allow to cool before refueling.
- Loosen fuel cap slowly to release pressure and to keep fuel from escaping around the cap.
- · Wipe spilled fuel from the unit. Move 10 feet away from refueling site before starting engine.


BLADE SAFETY


- Before each use, check to be sure that blade is firmly attached. Be sure throttle return to the neutral position when released and that the blade does not rotate at idle.
- A coasting blade can injure while it continues to spin after the engine is stopped or throttle trigger is released. Hold the
 coasting blade in heavy grass or brush until it stops.
- The front handle must be mounted properly. The front handle will assist in keeping the cutting attachment away from the operator.
- Exercise extreme caution when using the blade with this unit. BLADE THRUST is the reaction that may occur when
 the spinning blade contacts anything it cannot cut. This contact may cause the blade to stop for an instant, and
 suddenly "thrust" the unit away from the object that was hit. This reaction can be violent enough to cause the
 operator to lose control of the unit. Blade Thrust can occur without warning if the blade snags, stalls, or binds.
 This is more likely to occur in areas where it is difficult to see the material being cut.

In order to control the unit when Blade Thrust occurs:

- Main a good comfortable stance and balanced position.
- Always hold the handles firmly with both hands.
- Approach material to be cut from left to right so that the unit will be pulled towards the cut instead of pushed toward the
 operator.
- Always cut at full throttle. Blade has maximum cutting power and is less likely to stall or bind.
- Keep hands, feet, and unit in proper position.
- Cut only material recommended. Avoid letting blade contact material it can not cut, such as stumps, rocks, metal, etc.







1. ASSEMBLY

Mounting Engine to the Drive shaft


- Using the four (4) bolts supplied, mount the engine to the clutch housing as shown (Figure 1).
- With wrench supplied, tighten all four (4) bolts evenly and securely.

2. INSTALLING MID-HANDLE (Figure 2)

- · Snap mid-handle over shaft tube below harness hanger (top of handle should angle back toward engine).
- Install bolt, washer, and wing knob (Figure 2).
- Note: Handle may be repositioned for best balance and comfort.

3. INSTALLING THROTTLE CABLE (Figure 3)

· Open throttle as shown, and hook the end of the throttle cable to the carburetor. Carburetor lever attachment has a round hole to accept and capture cable end.



4. SUPPLYING FUEL:

• Fill the fuel tank with fuel to 7/8 full, using a mixed fuel of gasoline and 2 cycle air cooled engine oil.

REFUELING (DO NOT SMOKE!)

- Mix and store fuel in a container approved for gasoline.
- Mix fuel outdoors where there are no sparks or flames.
- Select bare ground, stop engine, and allow to cool before refueling.
- Loosen fuel cap slowly to release pressure and to keep fuel from escaping around the cap.
- Wipe spilled fuel from the unit. Move 10 feet away from refueling site before starting engine.
- Special Note: Never use gasohol. If gasohol is used, engine warranty will be voided. To test for alcohol content in gasoline, an inexpensive gasohol tester is available, order part # GM 27339.
- RECOMMENDED FUEL: THIS ENGINE IS CERTIFIED
 TO OPERATE ON UNLEADED GASOLINE
 INTENDED FOR AUTOMOTIVE USE. Mix Green
 Machine 32:1 or Green Machine Premium Exact Mix
 oil with gasoline according to the instructions on the
 package. If Green Machine oil is not available, use a
 high quality 2-cycle engine oil mixed at 4 oz. per gallon.
 DO NOT USE AUTOMOTIVE OIL OR 2-CYCLE OUTBOARD OIL.

Thoroughly mix the gasoline and 2-cycle oil before pouring the fuel mix into the engine's fuel tank.

⚠ WARNING

The fuel tank may be under pressure. Remove the cap slowly to avoid spurting of fuel.

5. INSPECTION

- Always inspect all fasteners for tightness and/or missing parts. Tighten or replace before use.
- Read and understand all safety and operating instructions before use.
- Check for any fuel leaks. If any, correct before use.
- Make sure all air passages are free of dirt, dust, or any other foreign material.
- · Inspect air cleaner for cleanliness.


6. STARTING THE ENGINE, WHEN COLD (INITIAL ENGINE STARTING)


- Slide stop switch (on top of trigger) to run position (towards engine).
- Push the primer pump until fuel flows through the clear plastic return line (Figure 4).
- Place choke lever in the closed position (Figure 4).
- Lock throttle lever in the start position as shown in (Figure 5).
- Pull starter rope slowly, until engine compression is felt (Figure 5). Pull the starter in short rapid strokes until engine starts.
- Avoid pulling the rope to its full extension as starter failure could result.
- Once the engine has started, slowly return the choke lever to its open position.



WARNING:

- Never smoke when refueling or refuel in an area with open flame (such as water heater pilot light). Gasoline vapors spread rapidly and are highly explosive.
- 2. Always stop engine and wait for it to cool before refueling.
- 3. Clean up any spills and dispose of clean-up materials.
- 4. After refueling, move to another area for starting.
- 5. Never over fill. Fill tank only 7/8 full to avoid spillage.





- Return the throttle lever to its idle position.
- Always allow the engine to run 1 to 2 minutes at idle for warm up before starting work.
- Special Note:

Place the unit on the ground when starting. Do not use your foot, or knee to hold it down while pulling up on the rope (Figure 6). This will cause the tube and cable to become bent and then break. Never allow the starter rope to snap back.

WHEN WARM (RESTARTING ENGINE)


- Hold throttle lever in the open position.
- Place choke lever in its open position.
- Pull starter rope as outlined in "Starting When Cold".
- Note: If engine fails to start, push primer until fuel appears in clear plastic return line.


7. STOPPING ENGINE

- Return throttle lever to its idle position, and allow the engine to idle for a short period (approximately 30 seconds). This allows the engine to cool down.
- Push stop switch to "Stop" position (toward the cutting head). Be sure to return the stop switch to the run position before trying to start unit.
- Note: Except for emergencies, avoid stopping engine while it is running at high speed, this avoids overheating the engine.

8. ADJUSTING

- Your Green Machine® engine has been adjusted at the factory for optimum performance and fuel consumption, and no further adjustment should be required. However, because of varying atmospheric and climatic conditions, some minor adjustment may be needed for your area.
- Adjusting idle speed should always be done with a tachometer to insure proper idle speed (2,800 to 3,300 rpm). If a tachometer is not available, the idle speed may be adjusted as follows (Figure 7).
 - Turn idle speed screw clockwise until cutting head or lower drive begins to move.
 - Turn idle speed screw counterclockwise until lower drive stops.
 - 3. Turn idle speed screw approximately 1/4 to 3/4" turn further counterclockwise.
- If the engine does not idle properly after this adjustment, contact your nearest Green Machine® dealer for service.
- Condition of the air cleaner is very important to the operation and life of the engine, and also has a major affect on carburetor adjustments. The air cleaner should be checked for cleanliness before each use, and before making any carburetor adjustments.





9. MAINTENANCE

Daily

- Carefully inspect complete unit for damaged, loose or missing parts. Correct before use.
- · Carefully inspect for any fuel leaks. Correct immediately.
- · Check air cleaner for cleanliness.
- Remove all dust, dirt, and grass from the entire unit after each use.

30-Hour Service, or Once a Week for Commercial Use.

- · All items under daily service plus:
- Remove, clean, and recap spark plug (0.7mm/0.025 inches) (Figure 8).
- Clean and service air filter (after cleaning, put small amount of engine oil on sponge and squeeze out excess) (Figure 9).
- Check fuel filter in tank and clean if needed. (Figure 9).
- Remove cylinder cover and clean out all dust, dirt, and foreign material.





SAFETY


- Before each use always inspect your Green Machine[®] for loose, missing, damaged or broken parts. Correct before using.
- Always wear approved eye protection (safety goggles).
- Due to the danger of thrown objects and the danger of striking others with the string or blade, keep bystanders and pets away from the work area at all times.
- · Do not wear loose fitting clothes while operating unit.
- Never operate unit while barefoot or wearing sandals.
- Never operate unit without shields or guards in place and in good working order.
- Use only genuine Green Machine® blades and rotary heads.
- Never use any type of wire in place of the nylon string.
- Never touch engine or muffler during operation, or immediately after shutdown.
- Never touch spark plug, ignition plug cap, or high tension wire while engine is running.
- Always make sure engine is securely mounted to drive shaft before each use.
- Always check for any fuel leaks before each use and correct before use.
- Never operate unit indoors or in an enclosed area.
- Your Green Machine product is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with it or use it.

10. OPERATION

- Before using your edger you should adjust the depth of cut by rotating the blade shield, which is attached to the guide/depth wheel (Figure 10).
- To adjust the blade's depth of cut, first loosen the wing knob as shown (Figure 10).










WARNING: Never adjust blade height with engine running.

Rotating blade shield back (toward the operator) will call reduce the cutting depth.

Rotating forward, will increase the blade's depth of cut (Figure 11).

- The best depth setting is that which produces a fine cut line between sidewalk and grass with a minimum of blade depth (usually 1/2 inch of blade in the ground).
- Blade depth may have to be adjusted for each edging job due to different concrete to grass heights.
- It is not recommended to adjust the depth to its maximum where not needed. This will only make the edging work more difficult and shorten blade life.
- To begin edging, first determine which direction you wish to travel so that your walking will not be on the grass. Always operate from left hand side.
- Always survey the area of edging for obstacles and items that may be thrown. Remove both of these dangers before beginning.
- Start the engine and run at half throttle before putting blade into the ground. Gentle lower the blade into the ground at the point you wish to start edging. Be careful not to hit the concrete (Figure 12).






WARNING: Always use eye protection (safety goggles) when edging. Always remove obstacles and throwable objects.

- Move forward as quickly as the blade and its cutting will allow. Do not force it, let the blade do the work.
- Use only as much engine speed as is needed to do the job. Overspeeding will only shorten blade life.
- While edging, try not to allow the blade to touch the concrete.
- The correct handling of your edger is shown in Figure 12.
- Note: Sidewalk edges that have not been maintained may require more than one pass to obtain a clean cut.
 Periodic edging will keep the edge neat and make the job easier.
- It is recommended that a watering of the edge area be done to soften the ground some time before edging.

11. MAINTENANCE

- Before each use, inspect the complete unit for loose or missing fasteners or parts. If found, correct before using.
- Replace blades as needed. Never wear the blade shorter than 3 inches.





 Each 10 hours of use, the gear case should be regressed by first removing the blade, blade flange washers and seal collar (Figure 13).



CAUTION: Greasing without removing blade and flange washers will cause gear and bearing damage.

- To replace the blade or to grease gearbox, first make certain the engine is stopped. Fit spanner wrench supplied onto flats of lower flange washer (Figure 14).
- Using suitable wrench, loosen blade bolt by turning clockwise. NOTE: left hand thread.
- Remove blade and flange washers for regressing.
- Remove only lower flange washer and old blade if only the blade is beiong replaced.
- Install the new blade onto upper flange washer. Install lower flange washer and bolt.
- Make certain the blade is properly centered before tightening the blade bolt.
- Turn counterclockwise to tighten the blade bolt.
- Tighten securely.
- Rotate the blade to see that the blade tips do not touch the blade shield at any point.







SAFETY

- Never allow children to operate the edger. It is not a tov.
- Always read and understand the owner's manual before operation.
- Keep area of operation clear of all persons; inspect the area for obstacles and throwable objects.
- Dress properly Do not wear loose clothes or jewelry. They can be caught in moving parts.
- Never wear sandals or operate barefooted.
- Wear long pants.
- Make certain engine is stopped whenever adjusting blade height or making repairs.
- · Always wear safety goggles.
- Keep all fasteners tight to insure that the edger is in safe working condition.
- · Never operate without the guard in place.
- Keep bystanders at least 50 feet away.
- Never operate near gravel or in especially rocky soil.
- · Never operate from the right hand side.

In the interest of the environment, MHI engines that meet strict emission requirements are labeled. "This ULGE engine conforms to 1995-1996 California Emission Control Regulations".

California Emission Control Defects Warranty Statement

The California Air Resources Board and MHI are pleased to explain the emission control system warranty on your 1995 utility or lawn and garden equipment engine (ULGE). In California, new utility or lawn and garden equipment engines must be designed, built and equipped to meet the state's stringent anti-smog standards. MHI must warrant the emission control system on your engine for the periods of time listed below. Provided there has been no abuse, neglect or improper maintenance of your utility or lawn and garden equipment engine.

Your emission control system includes parts such as the carburetor, air cleaner, ignition system, muffler and catalytic converter. Also included may be connectors and other emission related assemblies.

Where a warrantable condition exists, MHI will repair your utility or lawn and garden equipment engine at no cost to you including diagnosis, parts and labor.

MITSUBISHI HEAVY INDUSTRIES, LTD. Emission Control Defects Warranty Coverage

The utility or lawn and garden equipment engines are warranted relative to emission control parts defects for a period of two years, subject to provisions set forth below. If any covered part on your engine is defective, the part will be repaired or replaced by MHI.

Owner's Warranty Responsibilities

As the utility or lawn and garden equipment owner, you are responsible for the performance of the required maintenance listed in your Owner's Manual. MHI recommends that you retain all your receipts covering maintenance on your utility or lawn and garden equipment engine, but MHI cannot deny warranty solely for the lack of receipts or for your failure to ensure the performance of all scheduled maintenance.

As the utility or lawn and garden equipment engine owner, you should however be aware that MHI may deny you warranty coverage if your utility or lawn and garden equipment engine or a part has failed due to abuse, neglect, improper maintenance or unproved modifications.

2. LENGTH OF COVERAGE

3. NO CHARGE

4. CLAIMS AND COVERAGE EXCLUSIONS

WARRANTY COVERAGE SHALL BE EXCLUDED FOR FAILURES OF WARRANTED PARTS WHICH ARE NOT ORIGINAL MHI PARTS OR BECAUSE OF ABUSE, NEGLECT OR IMPROPER MAINTENANCE AS SET FORTH IN THE MHI ENGINE WARRANTY POLICY. MHI IS NOT LIABLE TO COVER FAILURES OR WARRANTED PARTS CAUSED BY THE USE OF ADD-ON, NON-ORIGINAL, OR MODIFIED PARTS.

5. MAINTENANCE

ANY WARRANTED PART WHICH IS NOT SCHEDULED FOR REPLACEMENT AS REQUIRED MAINTENANCE OR WHICH IS SCHEDULED ONLY FOR REGULAR INSPECTION TO THE EFFECT OF "REPAIR OR REPLACE AS NECESSARY" SHALL BE WARRANTED AS TO DEFECTS FOR THE WARRANTY PERIOD. 
